2. Hazards Identification

Potential health effects

Primary routes of exposure:

4. First-Aid Measures

6. Accidental release measures

7. Handling and Storage

Handling

Storage

10. Stability and Reactivity

Conditions to avoid:

Avoid all sources of ignition: heat, sparks, open flame. Avoid prolonged storage. Avoid electro-static discharge. Avoid contamination. Avoid prolonged exposure to extreme heat.
